Our school is helping The Children's Hospital Charity change children's lives every day by taking part in Pyjama Day Friday 10th February!

On February 10th (Reception to year 6) is supporting The Children's Hospital Charity by taking part in their Pyjama Day. We will be asking students to wear their pyjamas to school to raise money and awareness for Sheffield Children's, a hospital which some of our students and staff have used themselves.

Nursery children are invited to take part in this event on Wednesday 8th February instead of Friday so the majority of children will be in on this day.

Lots of children and families stay overnight at Sheffield Children's Hospital for many reasons so wearing pyjamas is a great way to help make their stay better by raising some vital funds. The fundraising from this event will make a huge difference at Sheffield Children's, including moving them one step closer to building a new helipad.

Currently air ambulances land in the park opposite the hospital and patients are wheeled across a busy main road for emergency care. Having a helipad on the roof would save vital minutes when every second counts for a child arriving in a critical condition.

The charity has currently raised over half of the £6million needed for their appeal and our support can help make the helipad a reality.

The Children's Hospital Charity couldn't build a better hospital at Sheffield Children's without the incredible support of the community. Together, our school will help make changes to our local hospital.
