

Curriculum	Spring 2 Learning
English	<p style="text-align: center;">Y3 Strong Mind</p> <p>Children will be learning to an instructional text focused on wellbeing and being a good friend. Reading lessons will focus on developing reading skills using non-fiction texts.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Y4 The Night Bus Hero</p> <p>Reading lessons will focus on developing reading skills using the text The Night Bus hero. The Journey – the children will be creating a narrative text following their work on the book Journey.</p>
Mathematics- Y3	<p style="text-align: center;">Fractions</p> <p>In this unit, children will learn to: order and compare fractions and understand equivalent fractions.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Mass and capacity</p> <p>In this unit, children will learn to: measure in grams and kilograms, compare and add/subtract mass. Children will measure capacity and volume in ml and litres , compare and sass/subtract measurements.</p>
Mathematics- Y4	<p style="text-align: center;">Fractions</p> <p>In this unit the children will learn how to recognise and show, using diagrams, families of common equivalent fractions, count up and down in hundredths; recognise that hundredths arise when dividing an object by one hundred and dividing tenths by ten, solve problems involving increasingly harder fractions to calculate quantities, and fractions to divide quantities, including non-unit fractions where the answer is a whole number add and subtract fractions with the same denominator</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Decimals</p> <p>In this unit the children will be taught to recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number of tenths or hundredths recognise and write decimal equivalents to 4 1 , 2 1 , 4 3; find the effect of dividing a one- or two-digit number by 10 and 100, identifying the value of the digits in the answer as ones, tenths and hundredths; round decimals with one decimal place to the nearest whole number; compare numbers with the same number of decimal places up to two decimal places; solve simple measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals to two decimal places</p>
History	<p style="text-align: center;">The Stone Age and The Iron Age</p> <p><i>Children will learn how Britain changed between the beginning of the stone age and the iron age, as well as learning the main differences between the stone, bronze and iron age.</i></p>
PE	<p style="text-align: center;">Y3</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Dodgeball</p> <p>In this unit., pupils will improve key skills in dodgeball such as throwing, dodging and catching. Children will be given the opportunity to play games.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Football</p> <p>In this unit, children will practice attacking and defending. They will develop an understanding of fair play and honesty.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Y4</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Fitness</p> <p>In this unit pupils will take part in a range of activities that explore and develop different areas of their health and fitness. Pupils will be given opportunities to work at their maximum and improve their fitness levels, recognising how the activities make them feel. They will need to persevere</p>

	<p>when they get tired or when they find a challenge hard and are encouraged to support others to do the same.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Tennis</p> <p>In this unit pupils develop their understanding of the principles of net and wall games. In all games activities, pupils have to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition. Pupils are given opportunities to play games independently and are taught the importance of being honest whilst playing to the rules.</p>
Computing	<p style="text-align: center;">Email</p> <p>In this unit, children will learn how to structure, write and send their own emails.</p>
RE	<p style="text-align: center;">The Last Supper</p> <p><i>In this unit children will be studying the days and events leading up to the death of Jesus.</i></p>
Music	<p style="text-align: center;">Y3 Children will begin learning to play a recorder. Y4</p> <p>This term we will be working on a unit about film themes and how they set the mood for the telling of the film's story. The theme tune to <i>The Pink Panther</i> by Henry Mancini provides the foundation for exploring musical storytelling through listening and composing activities. Improvise and compose, creating atmospheric music for a scene with a given set of instruments. Listen and appraise, recognising elements of the music that establishes the mood and character e.g. the rhythm. Talk about the effect of particular instrument sounds (timbre).</p>
PSHE	<p style="text-align: center;">Healthy Me</p> <p><i>In this unit the children will be focusing how to keep themselves healthy.</i></p>
